

## *Victorian Wonder – Clayton Mansion*

Step back through time into the Victorian home of Henry Clay Frick. “Clayton is a triumph of restoration,” wrote Susan Mary Alsop in *Architectural Digest*. It is also a triumph of preservation. An astonishing 93% of the artifacts in the house are original, making Clayton a home more than a house and an eloquent evocation of the lives of the family who lived there.

After the splendor of the Clayton Mansion, meander through the beautiful gardens to the Frick Art Museum. Built in 1969 to house Helen Clay Frick's personal collection of fine and decorative arts, the Frick Art Museum is truly a Pittsburgh treasure. According to Helen's wishes, the Museum was designed to exhibit her collection in an atmosphere of intimacy. Paintings are displayed with porcelains, bronzes, and rare examples of 17th and 18th-century furniture. And don't miss the antique automobile and carriage museum also on the property.
