



Presentation Topic: It Seemed Like a Good Idea at the Time!!



All of us deal with difficult issues, whether they be finding the right enabling technology or resolving nagging project constraints that prevent us from reaching our goals. This month's presentation deals with the subject of patents, intellectual property rights, and how seemingly the most innocent of decision choices can have grave consequences on our plans. Over the 200+ year history of patents in America, many inventions have been patented - some famous, some not-so-famous, and some just plain crazy. Many people are inventors, or their businesses involve inventions and innovation, yet most are not familiar with what patents are, how they are obtained, and how they work. The presentation gives the basics of invention and the patent system, and shows examples of patents from Eastman's Kodak® and the Xerox® copier to the "Combined Plow and Cannon" patented in Waterloo, New York, in 1862. The patents cover matters of life (the "Centrifugal Delivery Table") and death (an "Annunciator for the Supposed Dead"), and just plain fun (a "Gasoline Powered Pogo Stick"). There's even a patent on a better mousetrap - and a better mouse ("Transgenic Non-Human Mammals" issued to Harvard University).
