Directions to Inn at Essex (878-1100) 70 Essex Way, Essex Junction

--- From **Burlington**: Take I-89 north to Exit 15. Turn right onto Rt. 15 (Pearl Street) for about 2 miles. Turn left on Susie Wilson Road, and follow for 2 miles where it ends at VT-289 East. Take VT-289 East to Exit 10. Turn right. The Inn is a quarter-mile on the left.

--- From the **North**: Take I-89 South to Exit 17. Turn left, then right onto Rts. 2 & 7 at the stoplight. After 3 miles, bear left on Rt. 2A South, 5 miles to Rt. 289 East. Take Exit 10, Essex Way, and turn right. The Inn is a quarter-mile on the left.
