ROSA FIRELLI WINERY (Adults Only)

Sun, 24 June 11:30AM-4:30PM \$57

Take a tour of the winery and vineyard, learn how the wine is made and enjoy a wine tasting. During the walk through the vineyard, learn about growth seasons, pruning times, harvesting times and the different varieties of grapes. Learn how grapes are crushed, pressed, fermented and bottled during the wine making process. Enjoy a wine tasting where each guest will receive a souvenir glass and visit the gift shop. Lunch will be served outdoors in the pavilion.

After lunch, travel to the Prime Outlets in Ellenton. LOWRY PARK ZOO

The Lowry Park Zoo is recognized as the top zoological park in the country with its six main exhibit areas: the Florida Manatee & Aquatic Center, Native Florida Wildlife Center, Asian Domain, Primate World, Wallaroo Station and Safari Africa. During the summer months, "The Billabong" water-play area is available for the small children. Every day there are many Zoo keeper shows to let visitors get close to the animals and talk to the keepers who care for them. Guests can feed and interact with Stingrays, Giraffes, Lorikeets and the animals in the petting zoo. There are a variety of dining establishments in the park if the want/need for food or drink arrives.



SALVADOR DALI MUSEUM & ST. PETERSBURG TOUR

St. Petersburg once declared "America's healthiest place to live" is the home of numerous treasures both historic and artistic. St. Petersburg holds a Guinness World Book record of 768 days of consecutive sunshine. The city, named after St. Petersburg Russia developed as a major resort area of the state. Attractions vary from The Pier, the most recognizable landmark on the west coast, to the many cultural experiences

A highlight is the stop at the famous Salvador Dali Museum. See the largest collection of Dali works in North America. Bewildering double images and incredible paintings will surprise; sculptures, watercolors and drawings will amaze; and early impressionist-style paintings and melting clocks will delight. A docent will explain how and when the collection arrived in St. Petersburg and describe some interesting anecdotes about the paintings, his life and influences on his work.



TAMPA CITY TOUR

Return to the Victorian era as you stroll through the lavishly furnished rooms of the H.B. Plant Museum located on the University of Tampa Campus in the former Tampa Bay Hotel built in 1891 as a palatial resort. This elegant structure stands on 150 acres of lush tropical grounds overlooking the Hillsborough River. The Hotel was built and furnished by railroad tycoon Henry Bradford Plant recapturing an aura for an opulent Victorian winter resort. This magnificent structure, with its eye-catching silver minarets, was modeled after the Alhambra Palace in Granada Spain, and is on the National Register of Historic Places.

Visit Historic Ybor City where the heart of the Latin Community evolved. Vicente Martinez Ybor and other Havana cigar makers brought their factories and a new culture to Tampa, the city that called itself the Cigar Capital of the World. Tour the old Ferlita Bakery, once a major source of the community's daily bread. Now converted to the Ybor City State Museum, the bakery represents the story of immigrant families making their way in a new land. Visit an authentically renovated cigar worker's house with furnishings dating from the turn of the century.

During a stop at Centro Ybor there will be time to shop, get a drink or snack and feel the ambiance of the historic district.

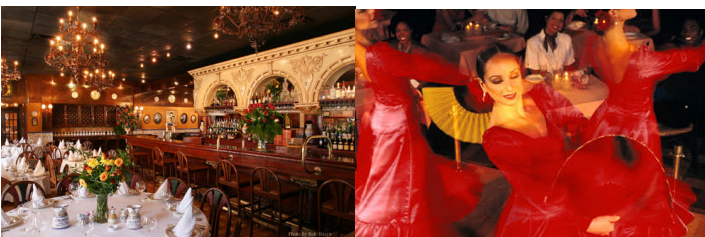
Other highlights may include a drive along Bayshore Boulevard, where lovely upscale homes overlook the Bay, and the waterfront area -- home to the Tampa Convention Center, The Forum, Garrison Cruise Terminals, Channelside Entertainment Complex, the Florida Aquarium and Harbour Island.



MUSEUM OF SCIENCE AND INDUSTRY

MOSI features over 450 interactive exhibits, with a uniquely designed space for children. Explore the science behind the powerful forces of nature: experience hurricane force winds, feel the ground shake during an earthquake, and observe the effects of a tornado. Admission will include a film in Florida's only IMAX Dome Theatre.



COLUMBIA RESTAURANT

Tue, 26 June 6:00PM-10:00PM \$75 (Children 3-9, \$39)

From humble beginnings in 1905, the Columbia has grown to be known internationally as America's oldest, largest and finest Spanish restaurant. Throughout the years, the Columbia has always been the place for excellent meals and the finest entertainment. Some of the world's most-talented flamenco dancers have been featured here, including internally known dancer, Jose Greco.

The Ybor City location is a designated national landmark and is much more than a restaurant. It is a dining experience. Whether seated in the historic "Don Quixote" room or one of the other ten beautifully decorated dining rooms, the food is outstanding, the service superb, and the mood memorable. Enjoy an authentic Flamenco dance show by a group of talented and beautifully costumed dancers.



TARPON SPRINGS TOUR WITH SPONGE BOAT DIVING EXHIBITION

Prosperous Tarpon Springs is still "the sponge capital of the world". Its lively sponge dock area, in the heart of the Greek community, is a mix of boats, boutiques and bakeries that runs for several blocks along the waterfront. Strings of natural sponges sway in the breeze, and the sights, sounds and sensuous aromas of the authentic Greek village fill the air. Some 25 restaurants and bakeries beckon with genuine Mediterranean dishes. Quaint and quirky shops line the sponge docks, offering everything from natural sponges harvested by local divers to elegant clothing, swimwear, jewelry and shells.

Visit the historic Unitarian Universalist Church to see the magnificent paintings of George Inness, Jr. The eleven paintings depict the extraordinary treatment of light and use of the green tones that were named after him. Some of these beautiful oil landscapes were once exhibited in the Louvre and the Corcoran Museum

See the St. Nicholas Cathedral, a replica of St. Sophia's in Constantinople. The 1943 Greek Orthodox Cathedral is the center of colorful pageantry during Greek festivals, including the annual celebration of Epiphany.

The St. Nicholas Boat Line conducts a 35 minute, narrated, round-trip cruise through the historic docks of Tarpon Springs. A diver in traditional gear provides a demonstration of sponge harvesting.

A tour of Tarpon Springs would not be complete without a stroll along the sponge docks. Browse through boutiques and many family owned gift shops, which contain souvenirs and of course...all kinds of sponges!

Church scheduled activities may prohibit an actual indoor sightseeing tour.



STARSHIP DINING YACHT

The upscale 180-foot Yacht StarShip certainly puts a big star in Tampa's cap for those desiring lunch or a dinner cruise from the downtown location where docking is at the Channelside Entertainment Complex next to the Florida Aquarium, within walking distance of the Marriott Waterside Hotel and Tampa Convention Center.

This jewel of cruise dining accommodates up to 600 passengers. The main dining deck of the \$7 million StarShip looks like a Scandinavian-modern nightclub with blond wood. The second deck features fish-patterned tables and

hanging racks of wine glasses. The sun deck is designed for patio like sightseeing for guests to enjoy the impressive Tampa Skyline as well as cruising past the upscale homes of Harbour Island, Davis Island and Hillsborough Bay. The vibrant colors at sunset are sure to delight passengers while the city lights after sunset makes for a shimmering tropical experience.

Guests can enjoy their favorite cocktails from one of the bars located throughout the vessel. After dinner, venture topside to watch the stars, dance to the music or just sit and enjoy conversation.
