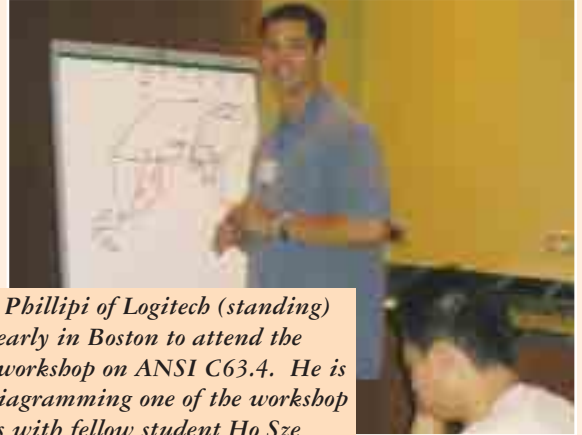


# Scenes from the 2003 IEEE Symposium on EMC, Boston, Massachusetts, August 18-22

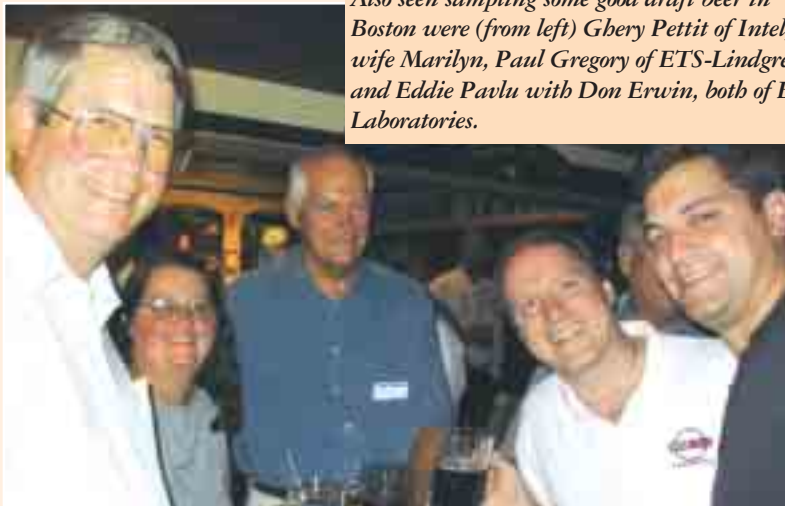

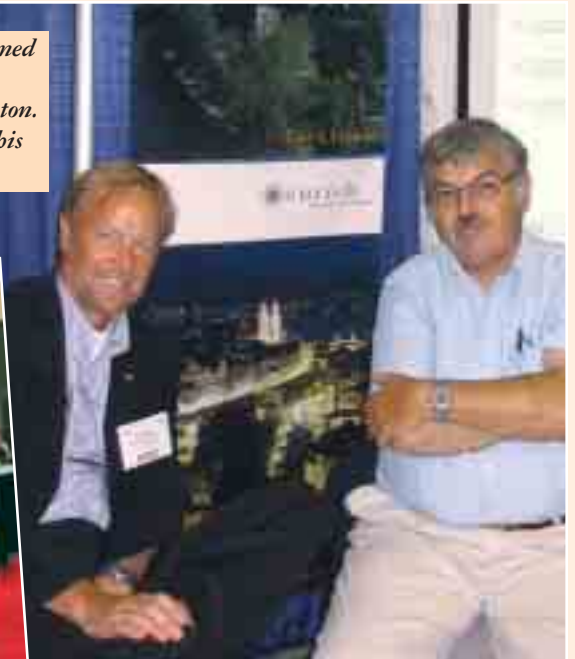
