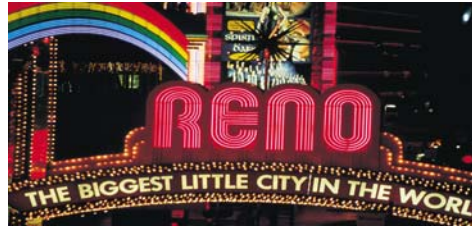

Manuscripts should be prepared in the standard 2-column IEEE format. For details of manuscript preparation and submission please see the conference web site.</p> <p>Topics : Fuzzy set theory and its applications including, but not limited to: approximate reasoning, pattern recognition, image processing, vision, data mining, fuzzy mathematics, decision analysis, web mining, software engineering, computing with words, bioinformatics, neural networks, evolutionary computing, control, neuro-fuzzy and other hybrid systems.</p> <p>Special Sessions : Proposals for special sessions (1 page) can be submitted to either Program co- Chair at kraghura@in.ibm.com or npal@cs.uwf.edu. Each special session must have 5 papers. The deadline for proposals is November 1, 2004.</p> <p>Pre-conference Workshop : The conference will be preceded by a one-day workshop on fuzzy logic and a few selected applications.</p> <p>Best Student Paper Awards : One or two awards will be given to authors of outstanding papers. To qualify for the competition, a student must be the principal author of the paper and the student needs to present the paper.
