## COMPUTER SOCIETY ELECTION HELD

The Computer Society conducted its annual election of officers for the operating year 1981-82 on 20 May at a brief business meeting following a tour of the Walt Disney World animation computer facility. Forty-two society members were present prompted by the opportunity to gain insight into the Disney computer opertaions.

The Disney computer facility tour revealed extensive use of computers for a multitude of functions. The facility is used primarily for real time control of all the characters in such favorite attractions as Tiki Birds, Country Bear Jamboree, Hall of Presidents, and Pirates of Carribean. Real time video and audio control is maintained by the computers of all security video cameras, background music, public announcements in the park and hotels, even down to the projector synchronization for Eastern Air Lines "Wings of Man". Fire and Security computer monitoring for the park, World Hotels, Buena Vista Hotels, Reedy Creek Utilities and River Country was also demonstrated. Local computer control of Space Mountain and Thunder Mountain is used because of the rapid response time required. Data are transmitted around the park and to hotels via 2 -wire serial data links, although fiber optics is being evaluated. Disney writes all their own software and performs all their own I/O design and computer integration. The EPCOT Computer Center will be all new and will use computers even more extensively.

## TAX-DEFERRED INVESTMENT

Younger engineers, self-employed engineers, and all other engineers not vested in qualifying company pension plans, are eligible for independent retire ment accounts on which taxes are deferred until retirement. ## DBX SIMULATOR - JOHN CLARSON

The DBX (digital branch exchange) is one of the family System Century digital telephone products produced by Stromberg-Carlson. The DBX Simulator is a software tool permitting testing of the DBX software on a software development host machine.

The Computer Society will see the DBX in its laboratory test environment, receive a briefing on the design of the DBX Simulator, and then see it demonstrated on an interactive terminal of the PDP 11/70.

This presentation will be from 7:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the StrombergCarlson Engineering Development Center on 17-92 approximately one mile north of state road 434. Entrance will be through the guard station at the rear (east). Allow a few minutes for badges to be issued.

The treasurer's report of 6 October was then approved on motion by Mendorf, seconded by Cram.

Chapters and committee reports were given as follows:

1. Communications Society - Don Mendorf reported a successful October meeting, although only 9 attended. The next meeting will be a tour of the Vista Telephone facilities of United Telephone on December 2. A meeting will be held in late January 1982, with a speaker presenting an update on NASA communications in support of the space shuttle effort.
2. Power Engineering Society and Industrial Applications - Jeff Dick reported their next meeting will be on the utility requirements and savings with earth-sheltered construction, on November 19.
3. Microwave Theory and Techniques - Ben Patz reported on communications with Al Fowler, chairman of the MTT Chapter. Al has obtained the required 12 signatures to establish an Orlando joint chapter of MTT and Antennas and Propagation. On motion by Cram, seconded by McClure, section approval was given for submitting this application to IEEE.
4. Publications - In absence of a Publications Chairman, Ben Patz reported that Executive Committee minutes are to be added to the notes because the majority of the section membership has had little cognizance of current activity within the section. The section secretary will deliver the minutes and meeting notices to the publisher directly, and the section chairman will deliver additional material directly until such time as a publications officer is available.
5. Membership and Development - Frank Fluet reported the October changes reported by IEEE show 21 changes within the Orlando section and 12 changes in group/society membership. Current Orlando section membership is 847. Don Mendorf requested that Frank procure a computer readout of Orlando section membership for each group and society. George McClure reported that Charlie Anderson, of Martin Marietta, who is a member of the administrative committee of the Electromagnetic Compatibility Society, is collecting signatures for establishing a local chapter of that group.
6. Publicity - David George will be soliciting input on items which can be used for press, radio and TV publicity. Letters will be sent to all members of the Executive Committee in November, with tentative plans for letters to industrial firms to follow.
7. Awards - Mannie Connell requested that the call for nominations for Engineer of the Year be included in the next section notes. He also needs nominees from the student branch for outstanding student awards, and he needs volunteers to assist him on the awards committee for evaluation of nominations.
8. Professional Activities - Ed Ellis requested comments on relative priorities in the USAB program - various pension, education and miscellaneous projects. A legislative alert has been issued by PAC on the federal budget cut in research funding. Ron Waters, Florida Council PAC representative, is resigning that post and is looking for a replacement.
9. Barbecue - The poor attendance at the section barbecue, held in October, was discussed. NTC will be replaced by Global Telecommunications Conference, GTC, in 1982, and GTC 82 will be in Miami.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:52 P.M. on motion by Cram, seconded by Khandelwal. The next meeting will be held at 5:30 P.M. 1 December 1981 at the same location.

## eXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

## 1 December, 1981

The meeting was called to order by the Section Chairman, Ben Patz, at 5:45 PM at Stromberg-Carlson Corp. in Winter Park. Those present, including late arrivals, were:

Chapters and Committee reports were given as follows:

1. Computer Society-Gerry White reported their next meeting would be Dec. 7, 1981, with Dr. Paul Wang talking on the subject of "Application of Fuzzy Set Theory to Pattern Recognition". Dr. Wang's availability for this presentation was not known early enough to distribute announcements earlier.
2. Autotestcon-Clark Hay reported that hotel banquet billing had been misdirected, and therefore has not been paid yet. The final reports should reflect a net income in the order of $\$ 12,000$, of which one-third will be given to the local section.
3. Microware Theory and Techniques - Al Fowler reported that their next meeting would be Thursday, Dec. 3, 1981, at Gary's Duck Inn, with Russ West of Transtec Corp. speaking on "Tailoring Ferrites for Microware Devices". MTT is also scheduling a meeting for Feb. 25, 1982, with George Bell of Microdyne, speaking on "Current Receiver Technology for Home Satellite Terminals". They also plan a Joint Meeting with Electron Devices Chapter, on Jan. 21, 1982, with Don Massey, of Raytheon, speaking.

Ben Patz reported receiving correspondence from IEEE announcing final approval of formation of the local MTT Chapter.
4. Aerospace and Electronic Systems - Dave Flinchbaugh reported on the joint AES-SME meeting in November on the topic "Aerospace Contributions to Space-Teehnelogy". The next AES meeting will be Jan. 28, 1982, at the Sundance Inn, Altamonte Springs, on the topic of Robotics. He expects this will be an exciting and well attended meeting.
5. Communications - Ed Ellis reported word from Don Mendorf, that problems in circulating publicity on their meeting scheduled for Dec. 2, is expected to reduce attendance. The meeting is to include a tour of some of the communications facility at Disney World.
6. Awards -Mannie Connell reported that nominations for "Engineer of the Year" nominees are due Jan. 15, 1982.
7. Membership Development - Frank Fluet reported he has received Fellow nomination kits.Nominations are due by Dec.12,1981. Frank has ordered a sort of the Orlando Section membership for AES, COMM, COMP, ED, IA, PE, and MTT. Delivery is expected by Dec. 18. IEEE has not mailed "Senior Member"
certificates to recent upgrades pending accumulation of a quantity of material for sending to an engraver.
8. Education - Fred Simons reported on the forthcoming IEEE Satellite Demonstration Course. He reported that fees for the short course have been set at $\$ 125$ for 4 hours of air time plus 2 hours of workshop.Orange Cablevision has offered their facilities for a classroom. After discussion, Bill Cram moved, and Gerry White seconded a motion to decline participation based upon (1) excessive costs;(2)delays in establishing contacts at Orange Cablevision due to transfer of the individual referenced by IEEE; and (3) nonreceipt of brochures from IEEE, for publicizing the course. The motion was passed unanimously. Dr. Patz will advise each of the involved IEEE personnel by telephone, and will prepare a letter explaining our position. Fred Simons moved that Ben Patz be authorized to forward this letter to IEE without necessity for review of its text by the executive committee as a whole. Gerry White seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Fred Simons also reported that he has located three possible library arrangements for control of circulation of the short course topic the section proposes to buy. These three are each in different areas at UCF. He is continuing to determine the best method of controlling circulation.
9. Ad-hoc Committee on IEEE Dues Increase - Fred Simons read a draft of the letter he has prepared. Russ Theisen recommended the letter be prepared for mailing to IEEE prior to their December, 1981 board meeting. Dr. Simons will prepare a final draft for signature by the section officers. Russ Theisen moved and Jeff Dick seconded the motion that the section officers be authorized to send this letter to the Presidents Executive Secretary, and board members of the IEEE and to the "Institute" for publication as an open letter. The motion passed unanimously.

Russ reported that the Washington Office of the IEEE will now accept any IEEE historical records for a central archives. 11. Section Meeting - Russ Theisen announced the Dec. 10, 1981 meeting scheduled at John Young Museum on the subject of Retirement Investments.
12. FCIEEE - Mannie Connell, Ben Patz and Dave Flinchbaugh will attend the FCIEE meeting at the Sheraton Jetport December 5, 1981.
13. Treasurer's Report - Joe Massett presented the treasurers report as shown below. Jeff Dick moved approval, Clark Hay seconded, and the motion carried.
14. Secretary's Minutes - The minutes of the November meeting were presented. On motion by Bill Cram, seconded by Russ Theisen, the minutes were approved. Jeff Dick commented on appreciating the format of the minutes and others generally concurred.
15. Publications - Ben Patz announced that George Taack has agreed to assume responsibility as Publications Chairman.
16. Publicity - David George's report on publicity was discussed. There was a consensus that the cost of professional public relations services was high for the purposes of the section. Without formal action, it was recommended that
we should investigate community service announcements on TV, Radio, Cablevision and newspaper.

SPEAKER: Daniel Masse', Principal Scientist<br>Raytheon's Research Division

GaAs double-drift IMPATT diodes have been developed which supply record power output and conversion efficiencies at 35 GHz . Considerable effort has been spent to further the state-of-the-art in material growth, diode fabrication and packaging technologies resulting in a device delivering 3 W CW output power with an efficiency of 22 percent. There is strong experimental indication that GaAs will show the same advantages at yet higher frequencies.

This talk will describe the state-of-the-art of our 35 GHz GaAs double-drift IMPATT diodes. Starting from our CW results and using a large-signal computer model developed in-house, the device capabilities under pulse conditions will be predicted.

Mr. Masse' received his diploma in electrical engineering from Ecole Centrale de TSF, Paris, France in 1951. He joined Raytheon Company in 1957 to work on the development of ferrite devices.

Since May 1980, as assistant manager of the semiconductor laboratory, he is responsible for the IMPATT diode and circuit business area.

Mr. Masse' is a member of IEEE and of the Microwave Theory and Techniques and Electron Devices societies.

Dr. Paul Wang of Duke University presented an interesting and informative talk on robotics at the December meeting. Ten persons enjoyed dinner at the Harley Hotel preceeding the meeting.

## IEEE COMPUTER SOCIETY NEXTED PROGRAM STRUCTURE CONSIDERED HARMFUL

In a logical extension of the classic 'GO-TO considered harmful' by Edsser Dijkstra which has led to development of a multitude of structured programming techniques Dr. Lori Clarke will argue that a nested program structure interferes with program development and readability and that the resulting treelike structure is generally an unnatural representation of the program. She will present a programming style that eschews blocks and the nesting of program units and instead uses packages like the Ada data abstraction construct as a mechanism for controlling visibility. The ramifications of this proposal for data flow, control flow, and overall program structure will be considered.

Lori Clarke received the BA degree in mathematics from the University of Rochester in 1969 and the PhD degree in computer science from the University of Colorado in 1976. She is currently an Associate Professor at the University of Massachusetts. Her interests include software validation and verification, programming methodology, and compiler design.

On March 18, PE \& IA will have Paul Lewis of Florida Power Corp., speaking on the Florida Power energy management program through which both commercial and residential customers are offered incentives to participate in their remote-controlled load management program.
7. Aerospace and Electronic Systems - Dave Flinchbaugh reported on the AES meeting of January 28.
8. Programs - Mannie Connell reported on the planned program for the Awards Banquet to be held February 13, 1982. Ben Patz requested reports on ticket sales be telephoned to him by Wednesday, February 10, to permit him to provide a final count to the restaurant.
9. Professional Activities Committee - Ed Ellis reported on a letter from Irwin Feerst reporting:
(a) A petition (copy available from Ed Ellis) for the Americanization of IEEE. As is the case with ASME, ASCE and AICHE, foreign engineers would not be excluded, but goals peculiar to American Engineers could become the goals of the IEEE.
(b) Concern over IEEE embracing the AAES and pledging $\$ 1$ of each member's yearly dues to AAES, without referral to the IEEE membership. Mr. Feerst has presented talks on this concern to eleven sections, and is willing to speak.to other sections if invited.
(c) Concern about accuracy of the AEA Technical Manpower Projection. He feels it may encourage more entrants into engineering studies than can be accommodated. More information on each of these items is available from Ed Ellis.
10. Awards - Manny Connell reported the Awards Committee has nominated Russ Theisen for the IEEE Region 3 Service Award, and plans to nominate Ben Patz as Region 3 Engineer of the Year.
11. Student Activities - Dick Miller reported on the current student activity preparing for the Engineering Fair. The student chapters have nominated an undergraduate student and a graduate student for outstanding student awards, and have nominated their department head for the section Engineer-of-theYear award.
12. Southcon - Ben Patz reported that he, Ed Ellis and Bill Cram will each serve for a period as host in the VIP Lounge at Southcon. Space has not been reserved for an IEEE membership booth, but the Southcon committee plans to allocate some space.
13. FCIEEE - Mannie Connell reports complimentary passes to Southcon are available from FCIEEE representatives and exhibitors.
14. Bylaws - No activity to report.
15. Autotescon - Clark Hay will present the section a check for $\$ 8000$ as the major part of the Autotescon profit distribution to the host section. The check will be presented at the annual awards banquet.
16. Tutorial East - Russ Theisen reported in excess of 100 registrants to date, with advance registration continuing through February 26.

## 17. New Business

(a) Jeff Dick moved that two free tickets to the awards banquet be given to each nominee for Engineer of the Year and each nominee for Outstanding Student Award. Seconded by Russ Theisen, the motion carried.
(b) Frank Fluet was requested to send two tickets and a letter of invitation to the awards banquet, to each fellow and each life fellow member of the section.
(c) Don Mendorf presented a copy of an editorial from EDN magazine criticizing the lack of concern of the IEEE Board for the wishes of the IEEE membership as a whole. Don recommends that all members make a habit of expressing their concerns to the members of the board, and particularly, expressing reaction to any actions which have been taken with inadequate opportunity for membership input to the decision-making process.
(d) Joe Massett moved that four student scholarships be awarded for Tutorial East 1982. Recipients should be selected by the Student Activities Committee, and the scholarships should be awarded "at the door" with no pre-registration, both because of reduced cost for such attendance and to discourage use for courses which may be over-subscribed. The motion was seconded by Don Mendorf, and was passed.
18. FCIEEE - Mannie Connell reported that FCIEEE has allocated $\$ 1500$ to provide free housing for students attending Southeastcon 82 in Destin, Florida. Dave Flinchbaugh should be contacted for names to be contacted by students wishing to take advantage of this opportunity.
19. FES - Ben Patz reported that FES may provide one free ticket to the FES awards dinner, for the nominee, from each engineering society, for the Engineer of the Year. Don Mendorf moved, and Russ Theisen seconded the motion that the section purchase a ticket for the spouse of the IEEE nominee. The motion passed.
20. Ben Patz noted that the student discounts, to IEEE functions for which there is a charge, have been retained at a fixed $\$ 1.00$ for ten years or more, while the undiscounted cost has increased by $100 \%$ or more. He recommended that this discount policy be re-evaluated. Mannie Connell moved, and Bill Cram seconded the motion that the student discount be changed to $20 \%$, rounded to the nearest dollar. The motion passed.
21. There being no further business, Ben Patz adjourned the meeting at 7:25 PM. The next meeting will be at 5:30 PM Tuesday, March 2 at the same location.

## PROPOSED REVISION TO REGION 3 BYLAWS

At its meeting on January 23, 1982, the Region 3 Executive Committee voted to propose the following bylaw revisions to the Regional Committee for approval. In the following description, items with the /// overstrike are to be deleted and items in italics are to be added.
Description of proposal number 1.
Revision Article II - Section 7 to add the Long Range Planning Committee and the Public Relations Committee as Standing Committees of the Region. These two committees have been in operation ad-hoc for several years and have demonstrated their value in meeting the needs of the Region. The proposed bylaw change is to make these two Committee Chairmen voting members of the Executive Committee.
Proposal number 1. Revise Article II, Section 7 to read:
Sec. 7 The Standing Committees of the Region shall be the Student Activities, Awards, Membership Development, Professional Activities Operations, Meetings, ahd Education Committeésl, Long Range Planning and Public Relations Committees.
Description of proposal number 2.
Approximately four years ago the Institute changed the deadline dates for nominations for officers to be on the Institute ballot to an earlier date than before. The officer candidates for Region 3 who are on this ballot are the Region 3 Director and the Region 3 Vice Chairman. Prior to the Institute's change of dates, the Region 3 Nominating Committee report was received and acted on at the Regional Committee meeting. Since the Regional Committee regularly meets in April with SoutheastCon, that date was too late to meet the new Institute deadline. For the last two cycles of nominations the Regional Committee has been polled by letter ballot to select the Region 3 nominees. There is concern that this procedure is not open enough to debate, discussion and substitution. While it does not appear practical to have the full Regional Committee participate directly without advancing the nomination process a full year, it does appear possible to have open nomination by having the Regional Executive Committee, which includes the Area and Council Chairmen who represent the Sections, be the forum for receiving and acting on the Nominating Committee report. The following proposal is intended to achieve that result. Proposal number 2. Revise Region 3 bylaw Article III, Section 4 to read:

Sec. 4 No later than Jahuaty 1 September $I$ of the bdd even numbered years a nominating committee consisting of at least three of the most recent past Regional Directors, living in the Region and able and willing to serve, will be appointed by the Regional Director. The Nominating Committee shall be charg. ed with proposing the names of either one or two candidates for Regional Director and either two or three candidates for Regional Vice Chairman. All Section Chairmen shall be advised of this appointment and encouraged to submit sug. gestions for nominees to the designated chairman of the nominating committee. The committee shall consider all suggestions and report its recommended nominees to the Regional Executive Committeel for approval. Additional nominations may be made from the floor by the Regional Executive Committee provided the nominees have given permission for such nomination. The Regional Committee, which has the final responsibility for nominating candidates for the ballot
presented to all Institute voting members in the Region, will nominate from the slates presented by the Nominating Executive Committee in accordance with IEEE Bylaws requirements.

When a single nominee is submitted for Regional Director, this nominee shall be the incumbent Regional Vice Chairman who was elected to that office in a prior competitive election.

As requested in last month's meeting, I contacted Roseanna Shultz's office at IEEE Headquarters concerning the Senior Member certificates. I was told they are still provided at no charge, but to allow two months for delivery.
5. Professional Activities Committee for Engineers - John Gilbert reported the change in name of PAC to PACE, made due to other common usage of the acronym PAC, outside IEEE. John also submitted a report on his trip to committee meetings held during Southeastcon 82, April 4-6. Included in the items discussed in Region 3 meetings and the PACE meeting, were the following:
5A. The proposed region by-laws changes published in the May 1982 Orlando Section Notes, were approved in concept. These changes, arranged to permit better section input to regional officer selection, will now be submitted to section representatives for a vote.
5B. John would like to see a section workshop on preparation for a PE examination. He was authorized to investigate possibilities further.
5C. Region III, with 43 sections, is one of the fastest growing regions of IEEE. 5D. IEEE hopes to increase membership from its present 221,000 to 225,000 by the IEEE Centennial year, 1984.
5E. Reed Thompson, Regional Director, outlined ten goals for each section, including growth, professional development, public relations, student activity support and recognition for conspicuous service.
5F. The Committee on Professional Activities for Women (COPAFW) has established a goal of COPAFW representation in each IEEE section.
6. Programs - Michael Harris reported rather low response so far on the scheduled May 5 meeting with Mr. Don Wiggins speaking on Patents. The next section activity will be the annual installation banquet May 22. Tickets have not arrived from the printers, but will be distributed upon receipt.
7. Old Business - none
8. New Business

8A. Michael Harris suggested there may be membership interest in purchasing coffee mugs with the IEEE logo. There was sufficient interest from those present. On motion by Al Fowler, seconded by Joe Massett, Michael was authorized to place an order for fifty cups.
8B. Russ Theisen announced that the call for papers had been issued for Southeastcon ' 83 to be held in Orlando. Tutorial Week East had a total registration of 602. Many attendees commented that the material was too basic, but some commented that it was too high level. The national software conference, scheduled for the Orlando Hyatt House, has been cancelled due to late loss of responsible chair personnel.
8C. Russ Theisen reported that, as of December 31, 1981, the Orlando Section had 15 fellow members, 112 senior members, 622 members, 54 affiliates, and 71 student members, for a total of 874 .
9. The meeting adjourned at 7:00 PM. The next meeting will be June 1, 1982, at the same location.
