1989 Installation of New Section Officers

Pensions

"Orchestrating Your Retirement" was the title of the talk given by George McClure, the featured speaker. George has resided in Orlando and worked for Martin Marietta since 1961, where he is now Program Engineer and Functional Manager. In the past, he has taken an active role in many issues concerning engineers as Region 3 PACE Coordinator. Now, as vice chairman of the IEEE Pension Committee, he has become expert in a complex and changing area of retirement planning and pension legislation.

For many of us, retirement seems so far off that we don't give it much thought. However, planning now can make a big difference in the quality of our retirement years, George handed out a packet of information at the Installation Banquet that clarified some of the changes that have taken place in pension and IRA legislation. He also gave plain English descriptions of proposed pension reform legislation and listed who we could contact to support or oppose these bills. These are important issues for the engineering profession. We very much appreciate the time and energy George has invested in becoming expert in this area. Chairman's Corner August 1989

This issue of the Orlando Section Monthly emphasizes our commitment to publish relevant information for the Orlando Section members while keeping a close eye on our budget. Jorge Medina has been instrumental in maintaining an affordable publication by cutting production costs and by obtaining support through advertising. We hope you find this issue informative and that you will patronize the advertisers where possible

Another cost-cutting effort was initiated last year by our outgoing Section Chairman, Tom Nelson -- the Voice Mail Center as described in a separate column of this newsletter. In this era of electronic mail, we feel that some of the function of the monthly newsletter can be served in a more timely fashion by the telephone system that Tom has installed and now operates for the Section. Eventually we hope to discontinue the monthly newsletters and realize considerable savings in publication costs -- but you, the members, will have to actively participate and use the Voice Mail Center for this innovative approach to be successful. Give it a try today be calling 366-7594. Because of his active participation in IEEE activities, Tom was able to secure funds from FCIEEE and Region 3 for this special project. Tom has served the section well, and we look forward to his continued involvement in the coming year.

As you may have guessed, the theme for my term as Section Chairman will be to deliver the maximum service to the Orlando membership within the limits of our budget. For last year, our expenses were over \$9800 and our

income from the national societies and headquarters rebate was under \$8400. The deficit was made up from our cash reserves of approximately \$6000 -- which were built up originally by hosting meetings and social events (\$3656) while publication costs, postage, and mailing labels for newsletters amounted to \$5610.

Our budget priorities for the coming year will be to continue to fund the chapter activities at the pace that the Chapter Chairman set, to keep publication and mailing costs within budget, and to provide seed money for meetings and symposia that will in turn replenish our treasury. In that regard, we are particularly thankful to George McClure for leading the charge as Chairman for the Vehicular Technology Conference to be held in Orlando in May 1990. Other conferences are also being planned, and while professional conference services will be employed, local IEEE volunteers will be needed to make things happen.

We now have nine chapters in the Section which "assemble, read, and discuss papers and matters relating to our trades or professions and at the same time enjoy pleasant personal and social intercourse, all of which is conducive to improvement and advancement in ideas, theories, practice, business, and good fellowship" as indicated in the original prospectus of the AIEE. To help ensure a viable chapter program, I challenge each Chapter Chairmen of Orlando to plan a program of nine monthly meetings next year, to solicit funds from your national society to supplement the basic allocation from the Section, to invite at least one national lecturer as provided by your national society, to fill all opening in your chapter officers, and to communicate with your chapter members. If this challenge is met, I am confident that the greatest possible service to the membership will have been delivered. And congratulations to Bob Gray (PE/IA) for cornering the Outstanding Chapter Chairman award for

The Florida Council and Region 3 jointly sponsored a special project of the Orlando Section called the Voice Information System with Telemarketing capabilities to provide current information on Section activities to members.



Background: Reedy Creek Energy Services recently commissioned it's new state-of-the-art Cogeneration Plant. This is a combined cycle operation utilizing a 35 megawatt gas turbine and an 8.5 megawatt steam turbine. The gas turbine is an aircraft derivative CF6-50 General Electric LM 5000 engine which is used in such aircraft as the DC-10, Boeing 747, and Airbuss A-300. a brief biography...

Michael Bass was born in the Bronx, NY in 1939. He received his B.S. in physics from Carnegie-Mellon University in 1960 and his M.S. in 1962 and his Ph.D. in 1964 in Physics from the University of Michigan. Dr. Bass joined U.C.F. in 1987 as Vice President for Research. From 1984 to 1987 he was professor and Chairman of Electrical Engineering-Electrophysics at the University of Southern California. From 1977 to 1984 he served as the Director of the Center for Laser Studies at U.S.C. Prior to coming to U.S.C. in 1973 he was a Senior Research Scientist at the Research Division of the Raytheon Company.

Professor Bass was amongst the first to demonstrate homogeneous broadening in dye lasers showing why they could oscillate over so broad a spectral range. His application of the statistical approach to the analysis of laser-induced damage led to the recognition of avalanche breakdown as the principal cause of this phenomenon in transparent media. Professor Bass also developed the technique of pulsed laser calorimetry to measure small intensity dependent absorptions. He is one of the co-inventors of the YAIO3 laser host, the flexible, hollow, metal walled infrared transmissive waveguide and the use of fiber optics to deliver laser light for the treatment of internal bleeding and tumors.

Professor Bass is listed in Who's Who in Engineering, and Who's Who in America. He has authored over 100 refereed publications and has presented many invited lectures in several countries and at international conferences. He is the editor of a book entitled *Laser Material Processing* and is the co-editor of volumes IV and V of the *Laser handbook*.

Professor Bass is a fellow of both the Optical Society of America and the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers. In 1979 he was honored as the first recipient of the U.S.C. School of Engineering Distinguished Researcher Award.

ABSTRACT: One of the major problems with extracting parallelism from conventional programs is the "Von Neumann Bottleneck" - namely a view of the computation as the result of changing locations in a memory in some time-ordered sequence. 


HOW ACTIVE YOUR IEEE ORLANDO SECTION WAS IN 1989?
