Some of these names (e.g., Electronic Transformers) have links back into history, and some (e.g., Diagnostics) might seem not closely linked with power electronics. However in each case a group of committed PELS members had an interest in that area and was prepared to "make something happen." The "guidelines" for these committees are that they should:

(1) Hold a meeting once a year. This is not very difficult. In general, book a lunch room at our annual meeting, let a few people know about it, try to get it on the conference notice board, and see who turns up. At least that is how I did it when I ran the Educational Activities Committee! I was always pleasantly surprised at the number of people who turned up, had a genuine commitment to the subject, and really appreciated the chance to meet like-minded colleagues and discuss issues. We made some decisions, and spent some society monies; for example we made a video, a CD, and we supported

"Education in Power Electronics" workshops around the globe.

- (2) Consider running say a biennial workshop. Not all technical societies do this, but Simulation, Modeling & Control, and Automotive have done this very successfully for a number of years.
- (3) Provide a source of reviewers for our transactions and our conferences. This networking aspect is really valuable, when we can identify a relatively small number of people with like interest in a specialist area.
- (4) Plan for a "Special Issue" of our transactions. These are usually published early in the calendar year, the most recent example being in January 2003 on Simulation, Modeling and Control. Although the lead time for planning is long, special issues have been very successfully taken up recently; and time slots for the next 2 years are already booked (Distributed Generation in 2004, and Integrated Power Electronics in 2005). The 2006 issue is open for bids, and an expression of interest has already been lodged. A decision will be made at

Chapter Award Nominations

To promote technical activities within PELS chapters, in 2000 the Power Electronics Society instituted a Best Chapter Award. The award is given annually to the chapter that makes the best use of the PELS supporting capabilities (Distinguished Lecture Program, Annual Financial Support) and conducts activities such as organizing conferences and technical talks, operating a web site, and promoting Power Electronics technology.

The Best Chapter Award consists of a plaque including the names of the chapter chair, secretary, and treasurer.
