What if the region offered a speaker/topic and 6 or 8 dates this year and R4 would pay the expenses for the speaker to go to a section for a workshop or seminar and the section guaranteed 10 or more attendees. The speaker could be a distinguished speaker on a good topic or perhaps several of them on different topics. Topics could include things like Inifiniband, Project Management, e-Business, XML, Internet Security, ISO Registration, DSPs, a PACE topic or ...

Brainstorming 2 and 3

Any section could find a room with projector and audio capabilities to be available for as many as they wish. We could ask a technical society to provide a speaker and materials. If a section did not want to participate individual members could sign in. We could pay for pizza for sections that cooperated to find out how many people attended.
- 3. We could ask our sections how the region could help them do a workshop or seminar and let them send us a bid. We'll do such and such and we need \$X and we'll contribute \$Y or resources from the section. We would pick some number of them to fund.

- 4. We have 1 in Minnesota and we've been told that we can use it, but we never seem to have gotten it done. They generally tie the colleges (community and universities) together.

- 7. We could fund a Region electronic technical magazine and offer to publish materials such as the papers which are being submitted to EIT. It could contain presentations that are being done at our section technical meetings for broader use.
- 8. There are probably many more possible solutions that would be good use of Region money and would raise the level of technical activity within the Region. This would at least give all of our 20K+ members access to more activity whether they choose to participate or not.
