




IEEE World Regional Map

 - -63.9% United States
- Growth during 2001
 - Regions 1 6 1.2 %
 - Region 4 Decreased 0.8 %
 - Regions 7 10 4.5%



IEEE Financial Results

- Net Assets 1996 \$ 77,467,000
- Net Assets 1999 \$ 131,630,000
- Results 2000 \$ (9,954,00)
- Projected 2001 \$ (21,000,000)



Financial Implications

- Moving of Reserves
 - All reserves belong to IEEE
 - Identified by organizational unit
- Dues increase in 2002
 - IEEE dues up \$ 15.00
 - IEEE-USA dues up \$ 4.00
 - Region 4 dues, no change
